

Greetings,

The Columbia Research Unit (CRU) and Project ACHIEVE (PA) invite you as a leader within the LGBTQ community to two community consultations to discuss about an important upcoming HIV prevention study called HVTN 703/HPTN 081 aka the AMP Study. This multinational study will be conducted among men that have sex with men and transgender people in New York City (NYC) along with other U.S. cities, as well as among other key populations in South America and Africa.

Who We Are

CRU and PA have partnered over the past 15 years in NYC on HIV biomedical preventive research within the National Institutes of Health (NIH)-sponsored HIV Vaccine Trials Network (HVTN). We have been testing HIV vaccines and other products such as long-acting injectable Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) and monoclonal antibodies (mAb) to speed the development of new and safe HIV prevention methods in a manner that is well-tolerated.

Our Research

As part of an ongoing Phase I study called HVTN 104 Study, we are currently testing the safety and tolerability of a product called VRC01, which are monoclonal antibodies that are infused in HIV-negative men and women. We are now preparing to educate, recruit and enroll HIV-negative men that have sex with men (MSM) and transgender people who are 18-50 years old and who are at increased risk of acquiring HIV into the AMP Study. The purpose of this Phase II study is to test if VRC01 can prevent HIV infection.

Community Consultation

We would like to host a forum that will increase your understanding about HIV biomedical prevention research, address any of your questions and concerns about the upcoming study, and obtain valuable insight from you on how to discuss this study with MSM and transgender people. We would like to share with you key study procedures and findings about VRC01 in this study and other studies that justifies moving it forward to the next phase of research (Phase II).

This is valuable information that affects the LGBTQ community that you can share with the people in your community

The first community consultation was held in Aug 2015 at Columbia University Medical Center. The second community consultation is scheduled for Friday October 30 fom 9a - 12p at 310 E 67th St, 3rd FI Boardroom. A breakfast buffet will be provided. 

























GETTING AMP'D: BUILDING THE PIPELINE
