Access to Study Data from HPTN 071 (PopART)

Data from the HPTN 071 (PopART) Study are available for use for research and scholarship. At this time, the data sets available from this study through the policy below include data collected from the study's Population Cohort (PC), by the Community HIV-care Providers (CHiPs) and from the study team investigating stigma. Data collection instruments and data dictionaries for the available data are available. Posted data are de-identified before release for sharing, with all personal and community identifiers removed. Data sharing for this study is governed by the <u>HPTN 071 (PopART) Data Sharing Policy</u>.

Data Access

Researchers wishing to access the HPTN 071 data who are not part of the HPTN 071 (PopART) protocol team must submit a *Data Access Application Form* for review by the HPTN 071 (PopART) Publications Working Group (PWG). The form should be emailed to <u>071PubsWG@hptn.org</u>.

If the PWG approves the concept, then the applicant will be provided a data use agreement form which must be completed and submitted before receiving access to the requested data.

The applicant may NOT share the HPTN 071 (PopART) data beyond the limited circumstances described in the data use agreement. The applicant also may not use the data for other projects or purposes unless the PWG has approved a separate concept/data access application form for the additional work.

Acknowledgements and Language Conventions

All products (manuscripts, presentations, abstracts) generated using HPTN 071 (PopART) data must acknowledge the investigators who collected the data, the study participants and communities, the institutions involved, and the funding sources. Acknowledgement language is provided for this purpose in the <u>HPTN 071 Publications Guidance Document</u> and **must be included**, as written, in all products.

Authors are encouraged to refer to the <u>HPTN 071 Publications Guidance Document</u> for other helpful information such as language conventions used by the HPTN 071 protocol team, agreed dates of study start and stop, protocol registration number, etc. Non-protocol team authors are not obliged to adhere to the naming conventions but using them may facilitate understanding.

Review

Products generated by authors who are not members of the HPTN 071 (PopART) protocol team do not generally need to be reviewed by the study team or the HPTN before submission, publication, presentation, etc. However, if an HPTN 071 (PopART) protocol team member is included as an author, then the product will require the same review as products of the study team. An exception to this rule will be if the product is a multi-study paper, in which case review will not be required even if an HPTN 071 (PopART) protocol team member is included as an author.
