Community Engagement

- Community Involvement Work Plan
- Community mapping
- Develop a database and lobbying of influential stakeholders
- Sustained relationships
- Community Health Worker Partnerships



Recruitment

- Investment in appropriately trained recruitment team
- Recruitment and retention plan
 - Inclusion and exclusion for eligibility
 - Establishing target goals for key populations
 - Updated at regular intervals prior to and during study implementation
- Population targeted needs assessment



Retention

- Teamwork (everyday, everybody's responsibility)
- Customer care training for staff
- Participant support and tailored retention
- Retention meetings and events
- Tokens of appreciation for participants



Results Dissemination

- Should not be overtaken by events
- Results dissemination plan
- Clear results, implications, next steps
- When results are embargoed strive for simultaneous results dissemination
