# COVID-19 RELATED POLICIES

#### To ensure air quality:

For air exchange, we constantly add treated fresh air into our HVAC system to ensure air exchange takes place to maintain air quality. In addition, public areas have CO2 sensors installed in the return air to check CO2 level and our building automation system automatically adjust the air exchange dampers accordingly to bring more fresh air into the space to manage air quality. We also use MERV 13 air filters in all of our public space including meeting space.
